

WILL MY FURNITURE FIT?

Before you buy your furniture, it's important to make sure that it will fit. Here is a useful guide to ensure your furniture makes it safely into its new home.

DOORWAYS

There are many ways to get large furniture into your home and some people have to remove windows in order to do so. If you're hoping to get your furniture through your doorways, please consider the below.

IS THE WIDTH OF YOUR FURNITURE SMALLER THAN THE WIDTH OF YOUR DOORWAY?


Then try putting your furniture lengthways.


- Open your door as far as possible and measure the width within the door frame. The total width of your furniture must be able to fit within with width.
- 2 Make sure there is a clear and obstructed path either side of your doorway, with enough room for the full height of your furniture to easily move through.
- *Don't forget about radiators and fixed furniture which may make your path smaller!

OR, IS THE HEIGHT OF YOUR FURNITURE SMALLER THAN THE HEIGHT OF YOUR DOORWAY?

Then try putting your furniture in upright.

- 1 As well as ensuring the height of your furniture is smaller than the height of your doorway, the total width of your furniture needs to fit through the width of the door frame (including any handles which may protrude).
- 2 Make sure there is a clear and unobstructed path either side of the doorway, with enough room for the full length of your furniture to more through.








WILL MY FURNITURE FIT?

HALLWAYS


Measure the width and height of your hallway at its smallest point. Don't forget about light fixtures, radiators and fixed furniture which may block your path to the room of your choice.





STAIRCASES

- 1 Make sure the width of your staircase at its narrowest point is wider than the total width of your furniture.
- 2 If manoeuvring around a corner on your staircase, make sure the longest part of your furniture can pivot around the corner.



^{*}Don't forget, your bannisters will reduce the total width available.
